What does Access mean to Livestrong

Access means that affordable, appropriate, and community-based treatment options are readily available to all who need them.

- Patient protections and essential health benefits should be enforced in U.S. healthcare reform
- Coverage should include everything a patient needs to heal no matter where they are in their cancer journey
- Payers or providers should be incentivized based on the patient-centered value they deliver, not the volume of cases

We have an opportunity to bend the curve of cancer around the world – it is time to act.

National health programs should establish ways to track the burden of disease and its effect on their communities

- National health programs must establish ways to better track the financial and social impact of the disease
- Development of standard practices for prevention, treatment and support should be an important part of public education and medical practice
- Member states of the United Nations should work together toward global cancer quality of life improvement and mortality decline through investments and agreements
